### Out of the Mailbox And Into the Stores

The muffins made by the New English Muffin company in Woburn, Mass. — firmer and denser than typical supermarket muffins — have until now been sold fresh only in the Boston area, and frozen by mail. Now they are available in New York, fresh. They have no additives or preservatives. Of the six flavors, I prefer whole-grain and five-cheese. The others are plain, cinnamon-raisin, blueberry and cranberry.

The muffins are about \$4 for a package of six at Whole Foods markets, Zabar's, Agata & Valentina and at Tuller Premium Foods in Brooklyn. Four frozen six-packs can be ordered for \$34.95, including shipping, at [newenglishmuffins.com](http://newenglishmuffins.com).
